## Lectionary 23, Proper 18 (Year B)

In today's gospel, Jesus heals a deaf and mute man using the word *ephphatha*, which means "be opened." The author of James exhorts the community of faith to guard against favoritism among its members. In baptism we have died to any distinctions that would separate us from each other. Likewise, at the Lord's table each one of us received the free gift of Christ equally and without discrimination. Through word, bath, and meal, God opens our minds and hearts to the healing and liberating gospel of Christ.
