Pastor Cris Frigm

Pastor Cris begins his ministry at St. Paul's with just under fifteen years of pastoral experience and entering his third congregational call. His journey toward being a pastor is rather long with a few key moments along the way.

He grew up in a small country church, or at least it seemed like a small church at the time. Baptized and raised in this congregation, he learned about his faith and was formed in the liturgy of the *Lutheran Book of Worship*. In his Navy career, he has served with the 4th Combat Engineer Battalion (Baltimore, Maryland), the Chief of Chaplains' Office (Arlington, Virginia), the 25th Marine Regiment (Quincy, Massachusetts), and USMC Training and Education Command (Quantico, Virginia). He has two deployments: Djibouti and Sembach, Germany.

Cris and Laurel have been married for twenty-nine years and continue to flirt with empty-nest-hood. Currently they share their home with two awesome dogs: Tonks (9-year-old mutt) and Remus (4.5-year-old Shepherd/Husky). Cole lives in Martinsburg, West Virginia and works for a commercial window manufacturer. Sydney is in her final semester of her master's in athletic training degree at the University of Virginia with a plan to make her love of football her profession.
