

A person of unclean lips, a former persecutor of the church of God, and three fishermen who couldn't catch a thing. More surprising still, perhaps, is that we are also called.

Worship at Home and Away

When we cannot be together in person, we can still hear the word of God and hold each other in prayer. Therefore, we offer the 10 AM service through simultaneous live streaming to St. Paul's Facebook page. The service is then posted to the website, www.stpaulsnewarkde.org and can be found in the upper right hand corner of the home page, along with a digital copy of this worship folder.

Large print worship folders and hearing assist devices are available in the narthex. Ask an usher for assistance. Two Praygrounds are available for young children—one in the rear of the sanctuary and one in the narthex.

A reading from Isaiah:

¹ In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of the Lord's robe filled the temple. ² Seraphs were in attendance above the Lord; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. ³ And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of the glory of the LORD."

⁴The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. ⁵ And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the Sovereign, the LORD of hosts!"

⁶Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. ⁷The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." ⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!" [⁹ And the Lord said, "Go and say to this people:

'Keep listening, but do not comprehend; keep looking, but do not understand.' ¹⁰ Make the mind of this people dull, and stop their ears, and shut their eyes, so that they may not look with their eyes, and listen with their ears, and comprehend with their minds, and turn and be healed." ¹¹ Then I said, "How long, O Lord?" And the Lord said: "Until cities lie waste without inhabitant. and houses without people, and the land is utterly desolate; ¹² until the LORD sends everyone far away, and vast is the emptiness in the midst of the land. ¹³ Even if a tenth part remain in it, it will be burned again,

like a terebinth or an oak whose stump remains standing when it is felled." The holy seed is its stump.

A reading from First Corinthians:

¹ Now I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, ² through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you – unless you have come to believe in vain.

³ For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, ⁴ and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶ Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. ⁷ Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. ⁸ Last of all, as to one untimely born, Christ appeared also to me. ⁹ For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. ¹⁰ But by the grace of God I am what I am, and God's grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them — though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. ¹¹ Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.



Through him all glory and honor is yours, Almighty Father, with the Holy Spirit, in your holy Church, both now and forever. **Amen**.



ADULT FORUM

Our Bible Study of the Gospel of Mark ("The Gospel of Mark, According to Greg") continues this Sunday starting at 8:30 AM in the Blue Room. Pastor Greg Johnson will walk us through three chapters of the Gospel, leading discussion around Jesus' teachings, His miracles, His compassion, His example of service, and Jesus as both true God and true man.

CONNECTIONS WITH CREATION

In *The Green Good News: Christ's Path to Sustainable and Joyful Life* (Cascade Books, 2019), T. Wilson Dickinson sees the story of Jesus calling the fishers as part of a movement to transform the food economy. He notes that fishermen, as part of a labor system, were "squeezed on both sides of their fishing trips, as they funneled their catch to the elite both in the form of paying an imperial official for the right to fish in the emperor's lake and on the back end as they had to pay a toll on their catch" (pp. 54–55). The fact that Jesus reached out specifically to these marginalized and oppressed laborers tells us something important about his work to disrupt the extractive economic system of his time—and ours.
