CONNECTIONS WITH CREATION

In Colossians, the writer urges us, "Set your mind on things that are above, not on things that are on earth" (3:2). Verses like this have been used by Christians to exploit the earth, but in the climate crisis, we cannot allow these sensibilities to go unchecked. Now we must set our minds on earth to be faithful, and this does not contradict the message of Colossians. The writer urges us to confess our sins: the climate crisis has been caused by human sin, especially by those in the Global North. Greed, which the writer calls idolatry, causes us to overconsume our shared and limited earthly resources. Yet in Christ we receive forgiveness of sins and are renewed in the image of our creator.
